MILESTONES OF COLLEGE RESEARCH COMMITTEE

1. Introduced Rig-Gter – Academic Journal of the Samtse College of Education, Samtse in 2005 and since then the College published three issues:
 - i). The first issue of Rig-Gter, Volume I in February 2006.
 - ii). The second issue of Rig-Gter, Volume II in May 2006.
 - III). The third issue of Rig-Gter, Volume III in August 2008.
2. Two rounds of Action Research workshop were conducted in collaboration and funding from the Support to Teacher Education Project (STEP).
 - i). First round of Action Research workshop was conducted from 13th to 16th October 2004 in College of Science and Technology (CST), Phuentsholing, where 11 participants were trained. The participants composed of officials from Center for Educational Research and Development (CERD), Lecturers from Samtse College of Education (SCE) & Paro College of Education (PCE) and one Asst. DEO.
 - ii). Second round of Action Research workshop was held in Samtse College of Education from 8th – 11th September 2005. There were 12 participants composing of Lecturers from the PCE & SCE, Officials from CERD and one ADEO.
3. The CRC forwarded three research proposals to Office of the Vice Chancellor, RUB in the past three years, and all proposals received research grant.
4. The CRC has initiated the publication of two booklets titled:
 - i). Writing Research Proposal
 - ii). Research Manuscript Guidelines
